 Already enough parks and school facilities
 Passive (not active) recreation

 3. The Emerald Necklace (Edison right-of-way) that runs north to south should be connected to allow for continuous open space and recreation areas.
 - Mean = 1.8 Median = 1 Mode = 1
 - Can be a foot/bike path—doesn't need to be parklike
 - Talk to County!
- 4. New open space in East Pasadena should be funded/created from:
 - a. Re-designing the existing public right of way (streets, sidewalks, etc.)

b. Landowners giving easements that allow access

Mean = 2.2 Median = 2 Mode = 2

- Would be nice, but shouldn't rely on this alone
- c. Collection of fees on new development to assist the city in purchasing property

5. Building heights along East Colorado should be designed to minimize obstruction of views.

Mean = 1.8 Median = 2 Mode = 1

- *Nice idea but not conducive to density needed to support dedicated street car.*
- With attention also paid to lower heights in transition areas adjacent to single-family areas
- It already is obstructed!
- *Not higher than 3-4 stories*

General Comments

- *Increase the allowable park for office 4 ½ / 1000 in the TOD*
- Not sure we need more pocket parks—existing pocket parks in East Pasadena are not used to any great extent.
- This is a completely unacceptable alternative as is.
- Note: No question about proposed Lake to Rosemead dedicated street car loop. Not enough density to support. Will still sap downtown vitality.
- Development in East Pasadena should be slow growth. Why does Pasadena keep developing while Sierra Madre stays the same?
- Build communities around schools. Use school properties for public purposes—community centers, parks, etc.
