





☐ Reduce AC costs with fans

Fans help you stay cool while reducing your air conditioning costs. Portable fans and ceiling fans keep air circulating, which allows you to raise the thermostat setting 4° and stay just as comfortable.

In the mornings and evenings, you can use window fans to blow cooler air into the home and warmer air out.

You can save about 3-5% on cooling costs for each degree you raise the thermostat.

Reduce pool pump run-time
