RESOLUTION NO. 7938

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PASADENA CALLING AND GIVING NOTICE OF A SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION, TO BE CONSOLIDATED AND HELD WITH THE CITY DISTRICT PRIMARY ELECTION AND THE PASADENA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT PRIMARY NOMINATING ELECTION ON TUESDAY, MARCH 6, 2001, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF PASADENA AN INITIATIVE ORDINANCE FAVORING COMPLETION OF THE 710 FREEWAY

WHEREAS, pursuant to authority provided by statute, a petition has been filed with the legislative body of the City of Pasadena, California, signed by more than 10% of the number of registered voters of the City, to submit an initiative ordinance favoring completion of the 710 Freeway; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has caused the records of registration and petition signatures to be examined and has ascertained that the petition is signed by the requisite number of voters, and has so certified; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has not voted in favor of the adoption of the ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is authorized and directed by statute to submit the proposed ordinance to the voters: and

WHEREAS, a consolidated City District Primary Election and Pasadena
Unified School District Primary Nominating Election will be held on Tuesday,
March 6, 2001, as called by Resolution No. 7930, adopted on October 30, 2000;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Pasadena does resolve, declare, determine and order as follows:

1. That pursuant to the requirements of the Pasadena City Charter and the laws of the State of California, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of Pasadena, California, on Tuesday, March 6, 2001, a Special Municipal Election, to be consolidated with the City District Primary Election and the Pasadena Unified School District Primary Nominating Election on March 6, 2001, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the City of Pasadena the following proposed initiative ordinance:

MEASURE A: Shall an initiative ordinance of the City of Pasadena be adopted to declare the policy of the City of Pasadena to be in favor of completing the 710 Freeway extension	YES	
between the I-210 and the I-10 Freeways, and to declare that such policy could not be changed or repealed without a vote of the people?	NO	

2. That the text of the ordinance submitted to the voters is as follows:

"AN UNCODIFIED ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PASADENA IN FAVOR OF COMPLETING THE 710 FREEWAY

WHEREAS: It is important that the voters of the City of Pasadena set City policy favoring completion of the 710 Freeway between the I-210 Freeway and the I-10 Freeway. Such a policy is important to the future of the City. With such a policy the City can commit energies and resources to the completion of the 710 Freeway. Such a policy will also communicate to elected officials and staff at the County, State and Federal levels the will of the people of Pasadena to complete the 710 Freeway.

The People of the City of Pasadena ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. The policy of the City of Pasadena favors completion of the 710 Freeway between the I-210 Freeway and the I-10 Freeway.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall not be repealed or amended except by a vote of the people.

SECTION 3. If passed, this ordinance shall be considered as adopted upon the date that the vote is declared by the legislative body, and shall go into effect 10 days after that date."

- 3. That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.
- 4. That the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.
- 5. That the polls shall be open at 7:00 a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until 8:00 p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, except as provided in Section 14401 of the California Elections Code.
- 6. That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.
- 7. That notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.
